


Walk For Poor Is A Success













Teachers Help To Build Future





As if things weren't going bad enough, Agua Fria then buried us 43-0. The Redcoats fought hard, though, and never gave up.

















Frosh Cheerleaders Are Young And Alive





It is because of this potential that Gerard maintains a superlative cheer squad, and the future of this depends upon girls like these in the Freshman Cheerleaders.











