

KEEPING THE SPIRIT ALIVE

On June 3 the Class of 1989 became the 24th and last class to be graduated from Gerard Catholic High School. Though the circumstances of Gerard's closing have been painful, we are left with fond memories.

Many of us feel our lives were shaped, in part, by Gerard. Many of us formed lifelong friendships, and many of us also carry warm feelings for those with whom we may have lost touch.

The Gerard Catholic High School Alumni Association was formed in Spring of 1987 in recognition of these things and with the hope that, ultimately, it could help support and promote the future of the school.

Unfortunately, the latter goal is not possible. However, we can preserve a little bit of the sense of community that made Gerard a very special place. The Association has been successful in re-establishing contact with 2,500 Gerard alumni, sponsoring four all-alumni events and assisting with the 10-year and 20-year reunions in 1988 and 1989.

The Association also instituted the Spiritus Award to recognize the achievements of Gerard Alumni.

Although much of the Association activity was selfsupporting, the Diocese of Phoenix subsidized it by paying a small salary for the alumni director and all of the newsletter expenses. Not surprisingly, we can no longer depend on this same level of support.

The diocese has agreed to give the Association continued use of a personal computer to keep accurate alumni records. The Association, however, will be depended upon to cover the expense of all other activities, including publishing a newsletter two to four times a year, and providing seed money and support for an annual all-class event and the 10- and 20-year reunions. The budget is modest, but the expenses are real. For example, a single newsletter costs about \$1,200 to typeset, print, and mail.

We can cover these expenses easily--<u>if</u> we all contribute something. Please support this effort in one of three ways:

*Make a minimum annual contribution of \$10 a year starting today and using the enclosed envelope!

*If you have a product or a service to sell, purchase an ad in your newsletter by enclosing a check for \$50 and a copy of your business card or other info.



JON HUBBS EARNS '89 SPIRITUS AWARD

On Wednesday, April 19, a distinguished panel of judges voted unanimously to bestow the 1989 Spiritus Award to Jon Hubbs, Class of 1968. Jon was honored for his far-reaching involvement in the community and the parish of St. Agnes. The following is Jon's acceptance speech when presented with the award at graduation ceremonies for the Class of '89 on June 3:

"I would like to thank the Committee for this great honor. I am very proud to receive this award among so many outstanding graduates from Gerard.

I began at Gerard 25 years ago. I decided that this would be a good time to evaluate my Catholic education; and besides, it's just good to evaluate your life every 25 years anyway. I asked myself, 'What is the real value of my Gerard education?'

First, I received a diploma as you are doing today. This diploma represented a complete high school education, an education good enough to prepare me for college. It helped me receive a college degree. I also received a baseball scholarship that helped me pay for my college education. It would have been very difficult for me to go to college without it.

At Gerard I also made what have turned out to be lifelong friends. Life-long friends are hard to come by. Friendship is something that you cannot put a price on. Many of the friends that are sitting next to you now will be your life-long friends. They are few to come by-keep them--value their friendship.

I am also a lifetime member of the Gerard Family. Regardless of what class you are from, when you meet a Gerard graduate, there is a friendship because we both know we shared something special. I met my wife Laura at Gerard. I have been married to her for seventeen years, and we have five children. They are most important to me. How can you measure their value?

Most importantly, I developed my conviction to be a Catholic and accepted the responsibility that goes along with being a Catholic. It has been the foundation



for my being an employer, an involved parishioner at St. Agnes parish, and a community volunteer. How do you put a price on all this? You can't. It is priceless. My education at Gerard has been invaluable.

I congratulate your parents for their sacrifice and conviction. They did not settle for the cabin up North or the second car and public school education. They have provided for you a priceless Catholic education. Catholic schools will only survive if Catholics seek a deeper love and understanding of God. Catholic schools will survive if we listen for our vocation as Religious, as parents, teachers, aides, volunteers, and as financial supporters.

This award is not for the famous actors, actresses and athletes that have come through Gerard. They have their awards. The true honor of this award is for those graduates who have given themselves to their parish and community as volunteers, coaches, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, etc. I am one of hundreds of graduates who have taken our Catholic education out of the classroom and used it in the parish and the community.

I ask the Class of '89 to join us in preserving our Catholic Heritage and not to be known as the last graduating class of Gerard, but rather the class of Gerard graduates. It is time to use your skills of prayer, of work, and of thought that you have developed at Gerard. I welcome you graduates to the Gerard Alumni Family. I accept this award for all graduates, living and dead, who love and serve Jesus Christ."
