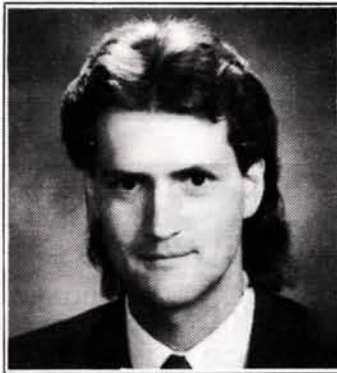

The incoming board members would like to express gratitude to Nancy Contadino, Terry O'Neill, Marty Clem, Bill & Terry Bollinger, Rusty Foley, and Rose Sieczkowski for their leadership, patience, and perseverance in the three years that they kept the organization going. We truly appreciate their hard work and dedication.

The new executive board has set three main goals for the Gerard Alumni Association in the upcoming year; becoming financially stable, finding a permanent home, and increasing the participation of the members. As always, money is needed to continue our operation

and we still need contributions to fund us for the upcoming year. To insure that the association has funds in future years, the board has decided to have a special fundraiser later this year to create a trust fund. Expect to see more details about this in upcoming mailings.

Although the closure of Gerard has left us without a home, the board is exploring the possibility of making our new home at St. Mary's. 3. And, June gives us more time to plan!

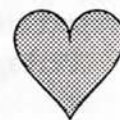
One nice thing you could always say about the class of '71 . . . we were always flexible!

## "Heart Transplant" Project Update

The Diocese is in favor of the plan to build the new gym, but will not approve it until all the arrangements are definite and secure. Matching funds of up to \$100,00 are available from a charitable organization, but the money still has to be raised to get them.

Right now, what is most needed are materials and labor for the foundation and concrete work. The committee has secured the wood floor from Camelback High School's old gym. This is worth \$25,000, but it's not much use without a foundation under it.

There is also still a large need for bricks. They only cost 67 cents, so let's all pitch in for a few. There is a space inside the flap of the donation envelopes for this. A more detailed list of needed materials is on

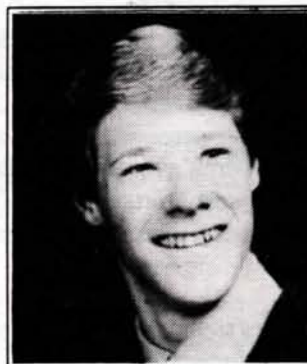
