

GERARD NAME CAN "STAY ALIVE" THROUGH COMMUNITY SERVICE

There is a program at Barrows Neurological Institute called "Staying Alive" which is headed by Gerard Alumni Sharon Garrett Hendrickson, class of '68. This program is an adolescent-focused peer education program espousing the philosophy that a safe driver must be completely drug and alcohol free. It was developed by a student committee working with the Orange County Trauma Society and is sponsored in Arizona by Barrow Neurological Institute and the Trauma Center of St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center.

The goal of the "Staying Alive" program is to stop death and disability caused by alcohol-related motor vehicle accidents. As sponsor in the state of Arizona Barrows Neurological Institute and the Trauma Center of St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center have designed the following objectives to meet this goal:

- * Conduct peer education training sessions in 50% of all high schools in Arizona by December 1990.
- * Provide this education to teenagers before they start to drive.
- * Develop and distribute a "Staying Alive" newsletter throughout the state offering practical insights on development and enrichment of the program by January 1990.
- * Establish a "Safe Ride Hotline" in three schools by December 1990.
- * Create an awareness of this community outreach program among all Arizona schools through networking.
- *Conduct a day and a half conference for existing and potential adult advisors in 1989 and 1990.

The Alumni Association, in an effort to keep the Gerard name alive, is adopting this program and searching for volunteers to help Sharon with her worthwile work. She can use volunteers in the following areas:

Getting your school to adopt the program Training Students as peer counselors Helping with paper work in the office Reading to patients We would like to inform the media shortly before Christmas just how many Gerard Alumni volunteered for this program and the number of hours donated. 
